

# Your feedback on the Mclvor Reserve Masterplan

From late April to mid-August 2022, we asked reserve users, neighbours, local residents and the community generally for their thoughts on improving Mclvor Reserve to support a growing local and municipal population.

As part of this conversation, we also sought to understand the community's appetite for an indoor sports facility at the Reserve.

There was almost equal support for and against an indoor sports facility.

## How we engaged

We used a range of approaches to maximise opportunity for community input.

This document summarises our survey feedback. We also had conversations at the Reserve, responded to over 400 questions, and engaged with 130 residents during an online community forum.

We also responded to emails, answered phone calls and undertook three letterbox drops.

Feedback from all online, written and verbal responses will help inform the draft Masterplan for Mclvor Reserve, which will guide future upgrades to the valued open space.

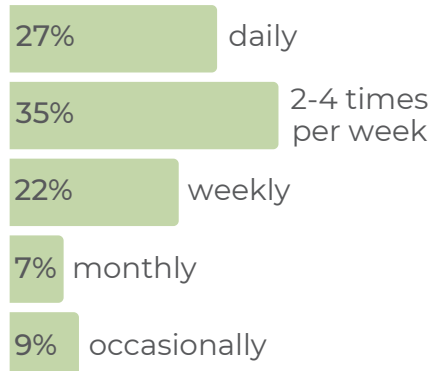

### How often is the Reserve visited?

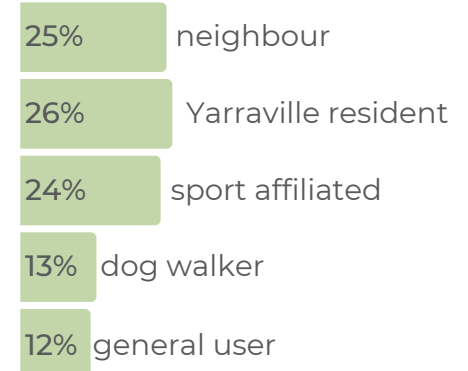


### Main reasons for visiting the Reserve

More shade, trees and seating

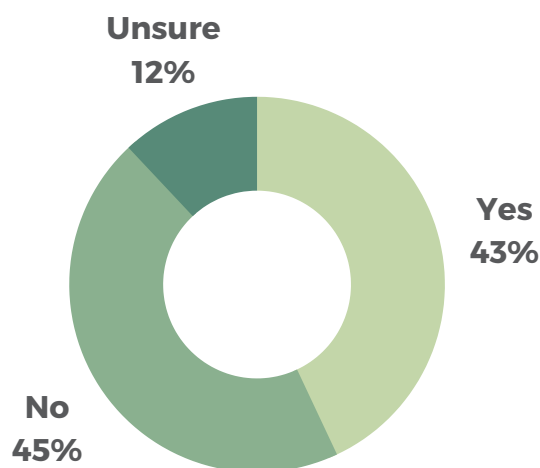


Better playing surfaces

- benefits the broader community

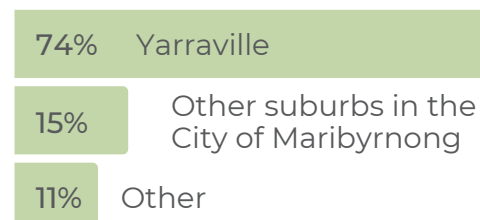
### Reasons against:
